Discovering St. Louis is more than just the Arch. St. Louis is chock full of intriguing places to visit and experience. So come away with us for a narrated tour which will stop at the Arch, Union Station and the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis. The day includes:

Laclede's Landing, a nine block historic area, named for the founder of the city, showcases century-old warehouses filled with nightspots and restaurants. Bumping along the original cobblestone streets will bring you to the riverfront where it all began in 1764.

You will stop at the 630-foot Gateway Arch to take a tram ride to the top if it suits your fancy or, if not, a film on how it was built, *Monument to the Dream*. A visit to the Museum of Westward Expansion will bring a glimpse of the gritty reality behind the Western legends you've always loved. The Indian Peace Medals are fascinating! Before leaving the downtown area there is the oldest cathedral west of the Mississippi, the Old Courthouse where the Dred Scott case began its way through the legal system and the new Busch Stadium, home of the St. Louis Cardinals.

Lunch will be at St. Louis Union Station which was the largest station in the country when it opened in 1894. Reopened in 1985 as an urban marketplace, it is now home to restaurants and stores and a perfect place for lunch on your own after a brief tour of the complex.

A "must stop" is the Cathedral Basilica of St. Louis. Its interior is covered with 85,000 square feet of mosaics, the largest such collection in the world. Your guide will conduct a tour of its interior. Be sure to have your camera for this breathtaking experience. If there is a wedding or funeral and the Cathedral is unavailable, the History Museum will be visited instead.

No trip to St. Louis is complete without a drive through the curving paths of Forest Park, one of the largest public parks in the United States. Filled with some of the city's major attractions, the Zoo, Science Center, Art Museum, History Museum and The Muny, it was the site of the 1904 World's Fair.

The cost per person is \$45.00 based on a minimum of 30 people per motorcoach. Cost includes a 54-passenger motorcoach, a professional Discover St. Louis guide, Arch admission and tram or film ticket, tour of the Cathedral, all reservations and arrangements. Gratuities for the guide and driver are not included and are at the discretion of our guests.
